Paul's Imprisonment at Caesarea (Part 2)

PAUL'S TRIAL BEFORE FELIX (24:1–23)

The last seven chapters of Acts tell of Paul as a prisoner. Paul had been brought to Caesarea and delivered to Governor Felix, who imprisoned him in Herod's Praetorium (23:23–35). Now, in chapter 24, Luke recorded Paul's first trial in Caesarea.

- 1. What does the word translated "attorney" in 24:1 mean?
- 2. For what reasons had the Jewish leaders probably secured the services of this attorney?
- 3. How true were the words of flattery that Tertullus spoke to Felix in 24:2, 3?
- 4. What were the three types of charges that Tertullus brought against Paul?
- 5. Why did Tertullus call Paul "a ringleader of the sect of the Nazarenes" (24:5)?
- 6. Why do brackets appear in 24:6, 8?
- 7. What did Tertullus probably want when he suggested that Felix examine "him" (24:8b)?
- 8. Why did Paul mention the number of days he had spent in Jerusalem in verse 11?
- 9. How did Paul show that he still identified himself with the Jews in 24:14?
- 10. What does the phrase "do my best" (24:16) mean?
- 11. What did Paul's reference to offerings mean in verse 17?

- 12. Whom did Felix have "a more exact knowledge about the Way" (24:22) than?
- 13. What does verse 22 tell us about Felix's faith in the Way?
- 14. Where might Luke have been during this stage in Paul's story?

"WHEN I FIND TIME": THE NON-CONVERSION OF FELIX (24:24–27)

Verses 24 through 27 comprise a classic case of procrastination in the Book of Acts: the non-conversion of Governor Felix. In the earlier part of the chapter, Paul was on trial for part of a day; in these verses, Felix was "on trial" for two years.

- 16. What three "accusations" did Paul make in his sermon to Felix and Drusilla, as outlined in 24:25?
- 17. What can the word "righteousness" mean?
- 18. How did Felix's reaction to Paul at subsequent meetings differ from his first response to Paul's message?
- 19. Why does history tell us that the Jews had Felix replaced?
- 20. How did Felix and Drusilla die?
